- 1. The ultimate goal of the Christian life is <u>union</u> with Christ.
- 2. This is a lifelong journey in which we bear the fruit of the Spirit.
- 3. We know we are beginning to achieve this when our prayer desires to reflect God's will alone.

<u>LifeConnect Group Discussion Questions</u>

- Andrew Murray, in *The True Vine*, wrote that the difference between work and fruit is that a machine can do work, but only a life can bear fruit. In what ways do we try to live our Christian lives in terms of *doing* rather than *bearing*?
- What sort of pain can be associated with Jesus' concept of 'pruning' in John 15?
- Notice that Jesus repeats the phrases "remain in me" and "bear fruit" as well as "love". How are these related?
- How do your prayer life and your bearing of the fruit of the Spirit relate?
- How would you describe the pathway of your Christian growth? Like a straight line? A long and winding road? Switchbacks? Something else?
- As a branch on Christ's vine, how would you describe the fruit in your life? Grade A? Juicy? Green? Wormy? Why?
- Spend time in prayer together, asking the Lord to help you move toward union with the Lord Jesus in your walk with him.
